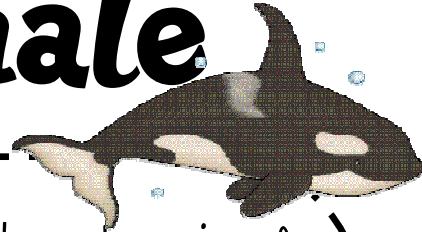


Orca Whale



The Orca or Killer Whale is the largest species of the oceanic dolphin family. It is found in all the world's oceans from the frigid Arctic and Antarctic to the warm, tropical seas.

Orcas are mostly predators. Some eat mainly fish while others eat small mammals such as sea lions, seals, squid,s and other whales. They live in pods of 6-40 members that hunt together and take care of each another when sick or injured. They can swim very fast up to 30 miles per hour.

Orcas are distinctively marked, with a black back, white chest and sides, and a white patch above and behind the eye. Calves are born with a yellowish or orange tint, which fades to white.
